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## TASTING NOTES

Spielberg Blauer Portugieser 2011 (Modrý Portugal) has a deep ruby color with fresh aromas of dark cherry. It is a medium bodied, fruity wine with nice minerality and pairs particularly well with duck and goose.

## VINIFICATION PROCESS

Hand picked grapes were initially fermented for 10 days then pressed and placed in stainless steel tanks for malolactic fermentation, after which the wine was filtered and re-turned to stainless for a further 3 months with sediments. It was filtered again and returned to stainless for 6 more months before bottling.

## ABOUT WINEMAKER

The Spielberg winery covers 160 acres a few minutes drive from the historic site of the Battle of the Three Emperors battleground in Austerlitz (Slavkov u Brna), where Napoleon put an end to the Holy Roman Empire in 1805. Historical records show that Napoleon sent Moravian wine home to France after this battle.

Spielberg wines have earned awards at the world's major awards competitions, such as Mundus Vini, Italian VINITALY AWC, Vienna International Wine Challenge and in London. The winery produces 14,000 cases a year with a focus on supplying private clients and high-end gastronomy, including Michelin star awarded Czech restaurants Alcron and La Degustation. Spielberg is also the primary wine supplier for Prague Castle/The president of the Czech Republic.
