TASTING NOTES

The Spielberg Welschriesling 2011 is refreshing and harmonious with a nose of meadow flowers. It is a luminous wine with green reflection. Welschriesling is a rare varietal in America. Pair with poultry, fish, cheese and salads.

Wine Enthusiast Review: Smoke and struck-flint notes add a dark tone to this savory, herb-inflected white wine. The palate is round and rich, and finishes with a reverberating hint of salt and bitter lemon rind.

VINIFICATION PROCESS

Harvested by hand on Oct 18, 2011, the Welschriesling grapes were pressed without the stalks and stems before undergoing controlled fermentation for 30 days. The wine was then matured in stainless steel tanks until bottling.

ABOUT WINEMAKER

The Spielberg winery covers 160 acres a few minutes drive from the historic site of the "Battle of the Three Emperors" battleground in Austerlitz (Slavkov u Brna), where Napoleon put an end to the Holy Roman Empire in 1805. Historical records show that Napoleon sent Moravian wine home to France after this battle. Spielberg wines have earned awards at the world's major awards competitions, such as Mundus Vini, Italian VINITALY AWC, Vienna International Wine Challenge and in London. The winery produces 14,000 cases a year with a focus on supplying private clients and high-end gastronomy, including Michelin star awarded Czech restaurants Alcron and La Degustation. Spielberg is also the primary wine supplier for Prague Castle/The president of the Czech Republic.
